### Orientation month:

The first month for all PGY 1's is the orientation month. This provides a reduced Emergency Department schedule, which is supplemented with daily emergency medicine lectures and labs. Additionally there is a weekend retreat which allows the new class to get to know one another, as well as provide insight into the challenges of being an emergency physician.

### Emergency Medicine months:

The shifts in the Emergency Department are 10 hours long. The shifts are staggered to reduce sign outs, as well as improve patient care. The first 8 hours of your shift are spent picking up new charts. At the end of those 8 hours, the next shift of residents starts picking up new charts. With the 2 hours remaining in your shift you can finish up your paperwork and provide a disposition to your remaining patients, or provide a clear decision tree for the resident to whom you are signing the patient out. The number of shifts worked per month varies based on year. PGY 1's work 20 shifts per month, PGY 2's 19, and PGY 3's 18.

### Didactics:

Conference is held on Thursdays from 9AM-2PM. This is protected time, regardless of which rotation you are on. Lunch is provided. Journal club meets one night per month.

### Research

All residents are required to do a research project to fulfill the Residency Review Committee obligation. This project may be one of their choosing, or they may participate in ongoing research. Authoring one of the following may also satisfy this requirement: published/presented abstract, peer reviewed article, review article, case report, or book chapter.

Pediatrics:

Our Emergency Department is constructed with a separate module for pediatric patients. This module is staffed by Emergency Physicians. All Emergency Medicine residents are scheduled 3-5 shifts per month in the pediatric module. During the pediatrics month, interns spend 1 week staffing the Pediatrics After Hours clinic. As PGY 2's, you will spend 1 month in the PICU, as well as 1 month in the Emergency Department during which your entire schedule will be comprised of pediatrics shifts.
